Want your students to explore new technologies and share their excitement about French with parents and community members? Wishing your students could articulate why language learning and cultural competence are valuable? If so, be sure to make the Student Video and Animation Contest a part of your National French Week festivities! Entries aren't due until November 30, 2017, so encourage students to start work on their videos and submit them for their chance at prizes! Please review the entry guidelines below for more details.

Theme: Mon Français, Mon Avenir / My French, My Future

Deadline: Videos must be received by November 15, 2018

Guidelines:

- The video / animation must relate to the contest theme.
- Minimum length 30 seconds, maximum length 2 minutes
- No copyrighted figures (i.e. Astérix, Snoopy, etc) accepted.
- Videos with references to alcohol, drugs or violence will not be accepted.
- French teacher of student(s) must be an AATF member.
- There is a limit of five entries per school.

Competition divisions: (1) Intermediate: Grades 6 – 8, (2) Secondary: Grades 9 – 12

Judging Criteria: Visual impact, relevance to National French Week theme, originality.

Technology Considerations: Students may use any video creation or editing websites to construct their submissions.

Submission Information: To submit contest entries, please upload the videos to YouTube and email us the link at aatfnfw@gmail.com . As an alternative to YouTube, you can upload the video to your Google Drive and then share the video with us using our email address.

After making your video available to us, please send us an email that includes the names of the school, the French teacher, division, and the students who contributed to the project.

All videos become the property of the AATF and may be used in AATF publications or materials.

Prizes: All participants in the video competition will receive certificates. The winning videos will be posted on the AATF website. First, second, and third place winners of each division will receive prizes.
